WHAT'S NEW

- Following the launch of the **Questionnaire on NGOs' Success stories in the implementation of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)** and the good response from NGOs in General Consultative Status with ECOSOC, the NGO Section / DESA invites all NGOs in Consultative Status to submit their success stories to share. - Celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the **Church Center for the United Nations** on 10 November 2003, Chief of the NGO Section Ms Hanifa Mezoui spoke on "The Meaning of the Church Center for the United Nations to the United Nations" and congratulated the **United Methodist Church**, in Consultative status since 1996, for its impressive achievements and active support to the Millennium Development Goals' implementation.
- **The International Forum on Rural Development** was organized in Brazil, Brasilia, by **FOCA (Fundação Oásis Cidade Aberta)** in November 2003. It is worth noting that although the NGO obtained consultative status with ECOSOC in May 2003 it already understands how to contribute to the implementation of the Ministerial Declaration of the ECOSOC High Level Segment of July 2003 and the Millennium development Goals. With the contribution of Ms Hanifa Mezoui, the outcome of the Forum was a "Brasilia Declaration on Rural Municipality Sustainability", which will be posted in the ECOSOC website at www.un.org/esa/coordination/ecosoc as sample of new paths for connecting rural communities to economic growth.
- A great number of NGOs attended on 20 November 2003, in New York, an **Information Session on the Work of the General Assembly and its Six Main Committees**, sponsored by the **Conference of NGOs (CONGO) in collaboration with the NGO Section / DESA**. A very friendly interactive and fruitful dialogue followed the keynote speech of H.E. Mr. Julian R. Hunte, President of the General Assembly (GA) as well as each of the six eminent panelists' presentations. The NGO perspective added value to the ongoing UN Reform with its call for an enhanced participation of the civil society at all levels including in the General Assembly. - As part of the work of the Second Committee of the 58th Session of the General Assembly, the Department of Economic and Social Affairs organized a **Panel Discussion on Partnerships** on 27 October 2003. Panelists representing various bodies and partners of the United Nations System discussed the vital importance and growing need for strong partnerships based on shared vision, open communication and complimentary competencies especially in an increasingly interconnected world.

- **World Day for Circles of Compassion** was launched on 2 November 2003 by the **Women's World Summit Foundation**, an NGO in consultative status with ECOSOC since 1995. As partner of the **Millionth Circle Movement**, the aim is to engage a dialogue process leading up to the **5th UN World Conference on Women in 2005** (Beijing +10). The World Day for Circles of Compassion calls on men and women of goodwill to invite friends, colleagues and acquaintances to create and nurture circles of compassion to enhance dialogue and cooperation. The rallying points are based on the following twelve critical areas identified in the **Beijing Declaration** and its **Platform for Action (PFA)**:
 1. The persistent and increasing burden of **poverty on women**
 2. **Unequal access to and inadequate educational opportunities**
 3. **Inequalities in health status, and unequal access to and inadequate health-care services**
 4. **Violence against women**
 5. **Effects of armed or other kinds of conflict on women**
 6. **Inequality in women's access to and participation in the definition of economic structures and policies and the production process itself**
 7. **Inequality between men and women in the sharing of power and decision-making at all levels**
 8. **Insufficient mechanisms at all levels to promote the advancement of women**
 9. **Lack of awareness of and commitment to internationally and nationally recognized women's human rights**
 10. **Insufficient mobilization of mass media to promote women's positive contribution to society**
 11. **Lack of adequate recognition and support for women's contribution to managing natural resources and safeguarding the environment**
 12. **The girl-child**
